

■Guide to Featured Works

4-7. Hiroshi Sugimoto, Seascapes Series

Hiroshi Sugimoto (1948-), who mastered the medium of photography both technically and aesthetically, has created outstanding works of art that have been exhibited at major museums throughout the world. He received the Mainichi Art Award in 1989 and the Hasselblad Foundation International Award in Photography in 2001.

For Seascapes, one of his most well-known series which he began in 1980, Sugimoto shot image after image of oceans and skies around the globe, each with the same simple, rigorous and ascetic composition, to achieve a sublime expression of time. His photos, most of which are monochromatic, are invocations of pure light. Given that the word "photograph" is derived from the Greek words for "light" and "drawing," the daytime and nighttime seas in Sugimoto's Seascapes may rightly be called "paintings of light."

9. Field with the moon, the subject called "Musashino" in Japanese, Edo period, early 17th century

Landscape paintings related to the seasons or famous places begin to appear from the beginning of the early modern era. These included a series of paintings referred to as Musashino-zu. Musashino is the name of a flat stretch of land that extends from present-day Saitama and western Tokyo into a part of Kanagawa. This name appears in anthologies of poetry such as the Man'yo-shu and Kokin Wakashu, as well as Ise Monogatari (The Tale of Ise). This desolate, expansive plain appears as a symbol of rustic beauty in many waka poems. This traditional image of Musashino is thought to be depicted in this present image. Here, gold leaf is used in the gilded clouds and a heavy layer of silver forms a crescent moon. Though the shape of the ears of the Japanese pampas grass and color of the Japanese clover leaves are slightly formalized, the leaves, delicately comprised of overlapping arcing strokes, fully convey the feeling of autumn within a wild plain that seems to extend beyond the borders of the picture.

10. Kumi Sugai, *Moon*, 1957

Kumi Sugai (1919-1996) moved to Paris in 1952 and held his first solo exhibition two years later. During his early years, he created paintings in the style of the Art Informel movement, using broad, powerful brushstrokes and delicate matière. His work *Moon* is an example of this style. From the 1960s, he changed his style drastically with paintings of simple geometric forms, vivid primary colors and simple compositions.

He is the recipient of many prizes and has exhibited at Documenta in Kassel, Germany (1959, 1964), the São Paulo Biennial (1965, winner of the Best Foreign Artist Award), the Venice Biennale (1968) and other international art exhibitions.

12. Kano school, Mountain landscape with waterfall*, Momoyama-Edo period, 16-17 th century

Waterfalls are a common subject in East-Asian landscape painting and they appear in many works that have come down to us. Some of these paintings also feature fowl, fauna and people. The main focus of this painting, however, is the water as it cascades down from the mountains, depicted by the artist with powerful brush strokes. This work is thought have decorated the *tokonoma* (alcove) in the main room (jodan no ma) within the temple.

14. Kano school, Scene based on an anecdote by Tao Yuanming*, Momoyama-Edo period, 16-17 th century

This picture depicts a scene from *Kikyorai* (Ch: *Guiqulai*) or *Returning Home* by the Chinese poet Tao Yuanming (365-427 CE). The poem speaks of Tao Yuanming's feelings when he resigned from his official post within in order to return to home in the countryside where he spent the rest of his life in accordance with nature and away from the temptations of the material world. This theme was a very popular one in Japan and was often represented in paintings. Depicted on the right side is a figure thought to be Tao Yuanming who has just returned.

* About the Paintings Used for Wallpaper and Sliding Doors at Nikko-in Guest Hall in Mi'idera Temple

This scroll paintings by artists of the Kano School were once partition paintings (shoheikiga) that adorned various chambers (ma) of the Nikko-in guest hall, one of the sub-temples of Mi'idera (Onjoji) temple in Otsu, Shiga prefecture. Hara Rokuro (1842-1933) acquired the Nikko-in and moved it to his estate in Gotenyama (present-day Kitashinagawa in Shinagawa ward, Tokyo) in 1892. At that time, the partition paintings were made into scroll paintings. The Nikko-in was subsequently donated to Gogokuji temple (Bunkyo ward, Tokyo) in 1928 where it became the Gekko-den, currently designated an Important Cultural Asset.
