Homage – Selections from the Hara Museum Collection

July 18 (Saturday) – October 12 (Monday, national holiday), 2015 Galleries A, B and C (Contemporary Art)

Within the context of a dramatically changing world, the boundaries of art continue to expand in response to advances in media, diversifying values and other factors. As in ages past, artistic expression provides a mirror by which to see a reflection of the "now." That image, however, embodies, more or less, the history and memory of the social milieu from whence it arose. All artists must face this aspect in the work of masters who went before them. By studying, referencing and reacting to past tradition, they seek to transcend it in order to attain their own expression.

Taking a hint from the concurrent show at the Kankai Pavilion, *Line and Space: Cy Twombly and East Asia*, this exhibition showcases works by contemporary art masters who, like Twombly, have left a solid mark in the history of art. Juxtaposed with these works, however, are works by artists of later generations. The intent of this comparison is to highlight the process of "appropriation" or "metamorphoses" by which new art borrows from the "classics," an act of homage that has played a constant role through the ages.

Admission: General 1,100 yen, Students 700 yen (high school and university) or 500 yen (elementary and junior high), Free for Hara Museum members, 10% discount for a group of 20 or more, Combination ticket for Hara Museum ARC and Ikaho Green Bokujo (except during Golden Week): General 1,800 yen; Students 1,500 yen (high school and university) or 1,400 yen (junior high), 800 yen (elementary), half price for those over 70, discount for groups of 20 or more

*For residents of Gunma Prefecture: Free admission for elementary and junior high school children every Saturday during the school term/200-yen-discount on admission for up to five persons upon presentation of the Guchoki Passport.

Directions: By train: Take the Joetsu Shinkansen to Takasaki, change to the Joestu Line, and disembark at Shibukawa. From Shibukawa, ARC is 10 minutes away by taxi or 15 minutes by bus (take the Ikaho Onsen bus to "Green Bokujo Mae"). By car: 8 kilometers (about 15 minutes) from the Kan-etsu Expressway Shibukawa Ikaho Interchange (in the direction of Ikaho Onsen).
